To say that Mary and the disciples were surprised by what they encountered at the tomb that First Sunday morning is an understatement. They are dumbfounded and bewildered by this inexplicable disappearance of their Lord's body. It is one thing to talk about resurrection of the dead,

and even have seen it when Jesus called Lazarus forth from the tomb, and quite another to discover an empty tomb, and angels, and then later, Jesus himself.

Anyone who has lost a loved one knows the haunting anguish of the

empty chair, the imagined timbre of a voice not there, the surge of whelming grief that pours from our eyes as water. No matter if their death was expected or unexpected, there is a surreal quality to our own lives in

the following days. How can someone dearly loved be with us, and then not, as if they never existed? We wish it was only a bad dream...

No one is ready to fully embrace resurrection until she has spent time in that dark place where hope cannot be seen. In reality, resurrection is the last thing we expect. We would not bury our dead if we expect them to come back to life three days hence. We would not bury ourselves in tears of grief when a loved one dies. We would not be in mortal anguish knowing that we will never see our loved one again. Never to have and to hold and to laugh and cry and share a smile or tear. Never!

But resurrection is not about chocolate and eggs, bunnies and springtime, women in hats, little girls in cute dresses, and lilies everywhere. It's about being surprised by more hope than we can ever possibly hold on to.

When Jesus rolls away the stone behind which we have buried our lives and invites us into his garden and into the light of his new day, we discover ourselves laughing despite the tears, smiling despite the pain, somehow knowing peace despite being bereft of the moorings to which we had anchored our lives. Therefore, we do not mourn as those who have no hope.

One day, death and pain and tears will be no more and the glimpse of resurrection that gives us our hope will be fully realized in the everlasting realm of God.

# **HISTORY TIDBITS!** Helen Kelly Brink –

#### The Baptismal Font

Around 1895 the baptismal font in the southeast corner of our sanctuary was given as a memorial to Margaret Dobbin Davison by her four sons - Moses, Isaac, William and Robert Davison. She had died in 1893 at the age of 72. The memorial gift was accompanied by a letter containing the following message: "In 1846 William and Margaret Dobbin Davison with their three young children made the voyage across the Atlantic from Ireland to New York City – then by packet boat up the Hudson and the Erie Canal to Dresden on Seneca Lake, thence by ox team to the Mansion House on West Morris Street in Bath. (This was a large hotel popular in stagecoach days. House now located at 13 West Morris Street is part of original building.) William soon obtained employment as a carpenter with Col. Ira Davenport on Cameron Street. Here a fourth child and second son Isaac was born. It so happened that he was so ill that his parents despaired of his life. But they considered it so essential that the infant should receive the Sacrament of Baptism and due to the fact that in that year there was no Presbyterian minister in Bath, they prevailed upon the Episcopal rector to administer the Sacrament of Baptism to Isaac."

With that background it was quite fitting for Margaret's sons to give a baptismal font in her memory. In 1959 her grandchildren placed on the font a suitable brass plate stating the above facts.

#### **A Moment For Deacons**

The little red wagon has been a fixture in the narthex outside Lyons Hall for several years. For those who may not know, the Deacons participate with other area churches to help feed the hungry in Bath. This is done through the Turning Point food bank and the Blessing Box, outside our church. The food items being specifically requested for the month are noted in the Tower Topics. These items (or really any items you wish to donate) can be brought to the church and placed in the red wagon. After the Blessing Box was put in place, we found that most of the items collected in the wagon could be used to help keep the Blessing Box stocked. Excess items and those that may not be appropriate to be placed there, are taken to Turning Point. In choosing food items to donate, you may want to keep in mind that often people who need the food do not have access to kitchen utensils including can openers, so flip top and individual serving size items are particularly helpful.

Whether the collected items are placed in our Blessing Box or are taken to Turning Point, they are important in helping us in this ministry. We offer our sincere thanks for all the donations to the Red Wagon collection so that we can continue to help feed the hungry in our community.
